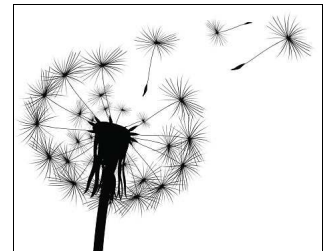

Dear Church Family,

As we enter the summer season I wanted to provide an update to you about a variety of things happening at WUC.

Possibility of CTK/ Church of the Epiphany co-locating at our building. We have formalized our dialogue with our friends at CTK /Church of the Epiphany. Our members at large, John Colkos, Nancy Peck, Bill McCollough, Nancy Krawczynski and I have started meeting with a group from CTK/ Church of the Epiphany. We met on June 21 at Christ the King. Pastor Susan and Pastor Nathaniel Anderson led us on a variety of exercises to help us better know one another as we embark on this important discussion. A walk-through of our building is scheduled for July 12 and another meeting of our group of representatives is scheduled for July 26.

The Pastoral Search Committee has finished their work on the extensive profile of Wilbraham United Church that must be submitted so that candidate pastors can evaluate the opportunity of becoming our full-time pastor. The Governing Board met on Tuesday, June 27, and voted to approve the profile that was presented by the committee. We owe a debt of gratitude to all the members of the Committee for their hard work on the profile document: Tom Toman, Deb Trimble, Steve Niederfringer, Tina Bazarian, Kim Neelans and Phyllis Walsh. Thank You! Please keep them in your prayers as they continue their work. (See separate update from them)

Vacation Bible Camp (VBC). The Christian Education Commission hosted a sign up for VBC this past week. The response was overwhelming. Over 75 children have already signed up for the camp. The excitement is building for another great week of VBC here at Wilbraham United Church. Way to go Paul!!

Budget. When we met at our annual meeting in January, the Governing Board promised to return to the congregation with information about changes in our budget. The recent changes in our maintenance staff has resulted in an improvement of approximately \$25,000 in our annual budget. This reduces our deficit from \$65,000 to \$40,000. While this is a good improvement, this process is still evolving and we hope to make additional improvements in the budget.

The Governing Board has moved to a “consent agenda” where we spend more time in our meetings discussing strategic aspects and important issues about the future of the church and our programs of mission that fit with the larger strategies identified by the transition committee. At this point it is working well.

Mission and outreach priorities. We have narrowed our focus to two major initiatives:

Further develop ways that the church can help address the opioid crisis.

Increase outreach to children and families by adopting an elementary school in Springfield through the Link to Libraries literacy program.

The Governing Board is still evaluating the school opportunity but discussion at the last two meetings has been well received. WUC’s involvement would include volunteers from WUC reading to children in third and fourth grades and providing books to the children at each reading. Stay tuned for more on this exciting opportunity that we hope to bring to the entire congregation. The Mission and Outreach Commission and the Governing Board hope to have a clear plan in place by the time school starts in September.

Settled Pastor Search Committee Update

The Settled Pastor Search Committee has completed development of both the UCC and UMC Church Profiles. These are required documents by the UCC and UMC which describe who we are as a church, describe our church community, define our vision of who God is calling us to become and define our vision of who God is calling to minister with us. These documents were reviewed and approved by Governing Board at their meeting on June 27. The UCC church profile consists of 50 pages and the UMC church profile is 12 pages. These documents will now be forwarded to the UCC area office and the UMC district office for their review and approval which is expected to happen fairly quickly.

In the UCC after approval by the UCC area office, a summary of our church profile is made available country wide to any minister seeking a new position. The UCC area office will forward to the Search Committee the ministerial profiles of those ministers who expressed an interest in our church. The Search Committee will review these and send a copy of our church profile with supporting documentation to those candidates in whom we are interested. There will then be a series of interviews and visits with candidates where there is a mutual interest until a final candidate is selected. That candidate will then be presented to the Governing Board and the congregation for final approval.

The UMC process is different since they place ministerial candidates only once per year, starting the selection process in January for placement effective July 1. Only one candidate is proposed for each church which has an open ministerial position for their review and acceptance. Since our current timeline does not fit into this process, we will not be receiving potential ministerial candidates from the UMC. However, if we have not been successful in filling our ministerial needs by the December time frame, we will inform the UMC district office and they will include us in their ministerial selection process at that time.

There are copies of the Church Profiles available to the congregation in hard copy in the church office or by e-mail with a request to Laurie. If you have any questions or comments on the Church Profiles, please contact any one of us on the Settled Pastor Search Committee.

Are you wondering about online gift card ordering? Have you thought about it, but don't know how to take the next step? Speaking from experience, it is a great way to get your scrip from your home or office computer.

Do I need something from Amazon today? No problem. I go to shopwithscrip.com, select the amount of Amazon scrip I need, place the order online from my home computer, wait a couple of minutes, get my gift card code and apply it to my Amazon order.

I also use it for reloading my Shell, Whole Foods, CVS, and Starbucks cards. Going to Home Depot for a home project? No problem, order scrip online, print out a gift certificate and you're on your way to helping the church with no planning ahead!

These are just a few ways of using online ordering. It feels great to give a percentage of my everyday purchases directly to our church. How do I do that you ask?

- *Log on to www.shopwithscrip.com and click on the "Get Started" tab at the top of the page.
- *Click "Join Your Existing Program" and enter our unique enrollment code (contact Connie Stiefel)
- *Fill in all of the required information and click "Register". Provide answers to the two "forget your password" questions
- *Now you can place and pay for orders online either by check or by enrolling in PrestoPay (advantageous for immediate scrip and reload options since payment comes directly from your checking account)

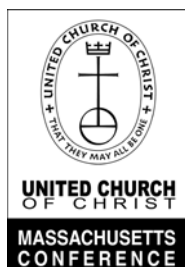
