In September, we began partnering with area Episcopal, Methodist, and UCC congregations in Church Without Walls, a ministry that brings worship and fellowship to Court Square in Springfield, and builds community across boundaries. We prayed with one another, heard the Word of God with one another, and shared the bread and cup of communion with one another. We shared stories and experiences of grace and joy and blessing, as well as tragedy and suffering and sorrow. We greeted one another with the peace of Christ and sang songs in one voice to the glory of God.

Our participation in Church Without Walls gives us the opportunity to build relationships with folks who are experiencing poverty, homelessness, hunger and joblessness in the greater Springfield area. It gives us the opportunity to see the face of Christ in others and to be the face of Christ to others. It helps us to better understand what it means to be faithful, loving, and gracious disciples of Jesus Christ.

I look forward to the third Sunday of every month, and our participation in Church Without Walls. I hope that you will consider

joining the congregation that gathers at noon in Court Square. We are always looking for volunteers to help before and during worship; to contribute food and distribute it after the service; to stand and be witnesses to the glory of God: feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, and loving our neighbors.

As we seek to live into our congregation's values and discern where God is leading us, we are offering extravagant hospitality to many, and we are also being lovingly welcomed into Springfield and into this particular community. It is my hope and my prayer that we will develop real relationships through this ministry, that we will bring our unique gifts to it, and that we will learn more about how we can be the church in our time and place. And it is my fervent belief that through our mission and our ministries, we will continue to find new places and new ways to share the love of God, the good news of Jesus Christ, and the presence of the Holy Spirit with the world.

SOLAR PROJECT UPDATE

Dear WUC Church family,

I am writing to provide an update regarding the project to add an array of solar panels to the south facing roof face of the sanctuary AND to request your help. When the solar panels are installed, they will provide 25,500 kilowatt hours of power over the course of an average year. This is roughly the same amount of electricity the church consumes annually. With various incentives from Massachusetts as well as the savings from not having to pay for electricity generally, the project will have a positive cash flow after only 24 months. Over 25 years, there is a proposed benefit of over \$199,000. After reviewing the savings and proposal from the solar company, Resonant Energy, the Physical Operations Commission and Governing Board voted unanimously to approve the project at their respective July meetings.

We are planning to replace the shingles on the south side of the congregation with brand new best in class shingles to reduce the need to disturb the panels for at least 30 years after they are installed. The expected cost of \$16,500 for the roof shingle replacement is something we would like to pay for from donations from members of the congregation. To that end, I have reached out to some families that expressed an interest in the project. Thus far, I have pledged of \$13,000 towards the cost of the roof shingles.

Would you please consider joining the 4 other families donating to the project?

While we would be happy with an additional \$3,500 in funds for the roof, any additional funds raised could be used to reduce the \$65,000 we are borrowing to fund the solar panel installation. If we raise more money, the solar project will be even more beneficial to the congregation for many years to come. If you care to donate, please call me at 596-4282 or email me at btrudeau@icne.com

The solar project is one that has numerous benefits:

- It provides a financial benefit to the church and makes a small improvement to our annual spending on electricity
- It sends a message to our members and our neighbors that we are investing in the future of our church and future generations. Using the sun to generate our electricity is gentler on the environment.

It reduces CO2 output the equivalent of 22 acres of forest

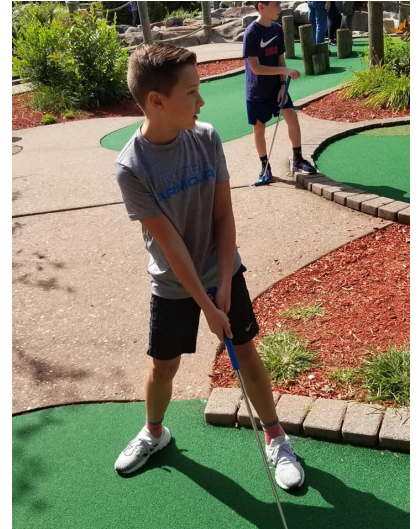

If you are not sure what that is, here is a statement from the American Red Cross:

If you're wondering what an AED is – and why they seem to be located in most offices and public buildings, you're not alone. In fact, because these devices are now commonly available, more people than ever before are curious about them.

So – just what is an AED?

An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

With an AED, we will be better prepared for a heart emergency if one occurs in our church. We have coordinated our purchase with the Wilbraham Emergency Medical Services, and this fall, we will be providing training to those interested in learning about it.

Change is coming...

Many thanks to all of you who currently buy gift cards and help support the church on a regular basis. The participation in the program definitely makes a positive impact on the church budget.

We have found the weekly commitment of those who purchase cards rely mostly on the grocery cards. Your support of buying Big Y and Stop and Shop cards for your weekly grocery and gas needs has been outstanding.

Here is where the change comes in...we will continue to keep in stock the cards that sell on at least a monthly basis. This would include Big Y, Stop and Shop, Amazon, Chipotle, Cinemark, CVS, Dunkin, Home Depot, Lowes, Starbucks, Subway, Unos, Walgreens and WalMart.

The cards we will no longer carry due to lack of activity, once our current supply runs out, are 99, Applebees, Bed Bath and Beyond, Buffalo Wild Wings, Cold Stone Creamery, Home Goods, Kohls, Lands End, Olive Garden, Panera, Red Robin, Regal, Shell, Staples, Target, Texas Roadhouse and Whole Foods. Certainly if you feel you can make a soft commitment of buying any of these retailers on a monthly basis, we will keep them in stock. Just let one of the team members know. We will continue to offer an assortment of additional cards in stock during the holidays.

How will you get some of these no longer in stock cards? There are two options... One way is to place an order (in person at the shopping card table on Sundays, email Connie Stiefel at cdstiefel@gmail.com, or online at shopwithscrip.com) and receive your physical cards the following week. You will need to place your order by Sunday to receive your cards by the following Sunday. A second way is to buy them online with instant access and receive electronic cards (by linking your bank account or credit card payments now available for a 2.6% fee)

To place orders online with ShopwithScrip, log on to their website, click on the Join the Program icon in the upper right corner, enter the enrollment code (3916BA2314489), and follow the prompts. You can choose from any of the over 300 retailers and place your order (you may pay by check or cash when you pick up your physical cards, by credit card online, or by linking your bank account online). If you want to link your bank account to purchase orders and/or have instant access to electronic cards, you may sign up for PrestoPay which requires a couple of extra steps.

LAWN REPORT

Well, this was a year for the front lawn weeds to win. With the wet Spring early Summer the weeds really grew and spread. Weed control spray, applied several times over the Summer, was only marginally successful in slowing them down. Will try again next year.

Other happenings outside:

1. Application of fertilizer with crabgrass control did a good job holding off the growth of crabgrass.
2. Violets have been a problem for years. Multiple application of a liquid product did kill off some of them. The most positive way to remove them has been to dig them out - a slow time consuming project.
3. All shrubs were trimmed two to four times
4. Lower branches on the smaller trees were cut off
5. A considerable number of daffodil bulbs were dug up from the bell area as they have become over grown. Perhaps more should be removed.
6. The lawn along both Woodland Dell Road and Brookmont Drive has been a problem since the town had drainage done there a year or two ago. The contractor built a temporary road on the Brookmont side and never removed it, just covered it with a poor quality soil. The road material does not allow the grass roots to penetrate it depriving the grass of needed moisture in dry times resulting in brown grass. On the Woodland Dell side it is the poor quality of soil supplied.

Looking ahead to next year several projects need to be considered.

1. Mulch should be applied to planting areas in front of the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall as well as the Brick Sign, street level sign and near the handicap ramp.
2. Extensive trimming should be undertaken to the rhododendrons along the front entrance to the church.
3. Plantings at the front corner of both the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall need to be cut back.
4. An aggressive treatment of the weed problem.

All expenses for the lawn, other than mowing, are off budget and are covered by donations. Should you care to donate to these proposed projects and the usual supply costs please send your donation to the office indicating for the lawn fund. I expect to purchase next years fertilizer shortly. as a supplier usually gives us a good deal in the fall.

Sincere THANK YOUS to those who supported my efforts to keep up our lawn, shrubs, and trees in presentable condition. This support came in several forms such as planting flowers, weeding various areas in front of the church, trimming bushes, transporting brush to the recycle center, donating cash to the lawn fund for the purchase of supplies and appreciated comments as to the appearance of the property.

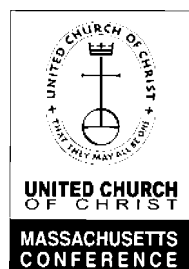
