A note from Pastor Chip...

Dear Church Family:

Last summer, the church office received an email purporting to be from me, asking the administrator to send gift cards out in the mail. It was signed, luckily, Pastor Wallace, which sent up enough red flags that the request was never processed. More recently, a parishioner received a text message also pretending to be from me. Because the number – and again, Pastor Wallace – didn't match up, the message was ignored. Finally, last month, I received an email from the Southern New England Conference of the UCC, informing me that many churches in the area, and even Conference offices, have received similar emails and texts over the last year.

In both instances involving our congregation, the scam never got very far, mostly because I use a nickname rather than my given one. However, I want everyone to be aware that I will never ask you – by phone or by email – to buy, send, or sell anything. If you ever receive a message or email along those lines, please contact the office before you proceed. If you have already gotten requests that sound like what was detailed above, I invite you to write down the interaction or pass along the email to me so that we can learn more about what's happening.

It's obviously discouraging to hear that churches are being preved upon like this: that our trust in one another and our generosity toward one another are being taken advantage of. It is obviously sad to learn that we have to second guess ourselves and even question the reality of what our eyes are telling us. I do not want anyone to become fearful, or untrusting, or to lose faith in what we stand for and what we deliver as a community of faithful disciples. That said, we must be careful with how we communicate some of our work in this world. To that end, I remind you all: I will never send an individual member or friend of the community such a request by email or text, and if you have any questions, concerns or doubts, reach out to me or the office.

We are a generous community. We give of our time, our talent, and our treasure. We are generous in our welcome and our hospitality, and we choose to share our love and our trust freely. We are generous in our spirit, and we choose to believe that our fellow members and friends have the best intentions. We should not let events like these change that outlook. We cannot allow ourselves to close off our generosity or doubt our hospitality. Our openness to those in need is a fundamental and necessary part of our congregation's mission and ministry. I hope that we will continue to operate and live as generously and extravagantly as we can, even as we take appropriate steps to ensure that we are also doing so responsibly.

We are grateful to so many of you who have made the weekly commitment of buying gift cards. Online/mobile phone orders can take place whenever you need the scrip, 24/7. This is a huge convenience to you, and convenience leads to more participation, which in turn helps our church!

Wilbraham United Church generously donated \$4,000 to the Mental Health Association (MHA) in 2019 and this pioneering nonprofit organization is pleased to share with us some of the ways this donation is at work. Since the donation was made, Dave Havens, Program Director of Homeless Services for MHA, and his team have successfully moved six people who were living on the street or in shelter into permanent housing. These are folks who had been long term chronically homeless.

The story of "Timothy" was published in the December 2019 Branchline. The second example of people who are being helped by the WUC donation to MHA is printed below. Their names have been changed, but their story is real.

Terry and Joseph

"Terry and Joseph" are two people who had been living together in Springfield in a vehicle (properly registered) for 3 years and 5 months. In the largely commercial neighborhood where they were staying, the vendors and shopkeepers have mostly showed them a level of tolerance, allowing them to park overnight without a hassle.

"The small businesspeople in the area have also been a source of information for us when we're looking for Terry and Joseph," said Dave Havens, Program Director of Homeless Services for MHA. "It's nice to see some kindness. The combination of being left alone and people also watching out for them was good. Someone would usually step in if there was a need, and Joseph had both mental health and chronic medical issues he was desperately trying to manage."

At one point, someone did go after Terry and Joseph, resulting in their vehicle getting towed. "Eventually they managed to pick up a night time delivery job, which was helpful because it kept their vehicle out of parking lots overnight," Dave explained. "We reached out to them and in time they agreed to let us help. We found them a two bedroom apartment they could move into and now they're doing pretty well. Things are always easier when you're living inside. Instead of focusing on just trying to survive, they're now able to focus on Joseph's health."
