### A note from Pastor Chip

#### Dear Church,

It's hard to believe that it's already September again! This has been unprecedented for many of us. We have had to change and adapt, to learn new things and try new ideas. As of Homecoming Sunday, we will have been live-streaming our Sunday worship services for exactly a year and a half. While we are back worshipping in person, we have decided to continue streaming for those who cannot be present with us in the sanctuary for whatever reason. Streaming has allowed us to welcome more people who are curious about community, and strengthened the bonds between among those of us who already know about the extravagant hospitality and generous faith that we share at Wilbraham United.

As we gather to start a new year, we hope that our programs and events will feel familiar but with new energy. On Sunday mornings, we will have ushers and greeters and a liturgist, but we will not be passing the offering plate just yet. We hope that you will leave your pledge or offering in the plate provided in the narthex. Church School is back in session and in person! We ask that all children (and teachers) wear masks, just as they will in school. Nursery Care will also be available during worship.

To begin the year, the Bell Choir will be leading our music program, under Mark's direction. He is hopeful and faithful that he will be have the opportunity to direct all our choirs before he takes his leave from us in November. The search for a new Director of Music Ministries — not a replacement for Mark, which would be impossible! — is ongoing, and we look forward to bringing you more news soon. If you have any questions about the search process, please reach out to me.

Bible Study will also be returning in a few weeks. We may be offering both in-person and online discussion groups to deepen our faith and increase our understanding of our role in the unfolding of God's history. There will be other opportunities for discussion, fellowship and discipleship throughout the fall.

Lastly, we are recovering not only from the consequences the pandemic has had on our community, but the flooding we received in July. As of now, thanks partly to our insurance and mostly to generous donations from friends and members, we have paid for all the immediate repairs. We raised over \$16,000 dollars, and only had to use our own budget to cover less than \$300. Unfortunately, we learned that our furnace was rendered inoperable by the water, and we are in the process of collecting estimates. This is likely to be a significant expense, but the old furnace was nearing the end of its life-expectancy and any replacement will be far more efficient, which will be better for our financial and environmental stewardship.

I will have much more to say about this — and so much more — in the coming weeks, but I wanted everyone to know how excited I am to see you all again, how grateful I am for your faith, your support and your generosity, and how hopeful I am for our future together. May this year bring us blessings, and may we be blessings to one another, to our community and to our world, in the name of Christ and for the glory of God.
