

Dear Church Family:

We have entered the final month of the year, and the busyness of the holiday season is in full swing. If my house is any indication, many of us have already dragged out the ornaments and lights, put up the wreaths and the stockings, and dusted off the knick-knacks and heirlooms that signal the arrival of the Christmas season. The rituals of preparing our homes may differ one to another, but all of us have some way we ready ourselves and our families for the season to come.

In our church, we change out our paraments and banners, set up the advent wreath, switch our sung responses and, seemingly overnight – but with tremendous effort by so many behind the scenes – transform our building into a winter wonderland for the Holly Fair, happening on Saturday, December 11th. We are tremendously grateful that Kim Ryan has volunteered to coordinate this year's fair, and she has done a fantastic job restarting and adapting after we were forced to cancel in 2020. And we are grateful to and for all the Lug Nuts, café workers, raffle sellers, cookie bakers, and the dozens and dozens who will help out in the coming days to ensure a wonderful experience of extravagant welcome for all who enter our doors that day.

The transformation for the Holly Fair – the garlands strung from the ceilings, the colorfully and expertly wrapped bulletin boards, the giant tree, the energy and enthusiasm that fills our halls - has become a wonderful reminder of the ways in the world. God is with us, Emmanuel. which we are asked to prepare ourselves and our community during the season of Advent. There is a collaborative metamorphosis of our building and our community. We marshal our gifts and our experience to share with one another and our

friends and neighbors. We partake in a generous and joyous spirit that gives us the strength to do the hard work needed to pull off such an event.

God is with us as we shine that light into the darkness, and cast away all fear. God is with us as we reveal to the world what has been revealed to us. God is with us as we bring joy and peace, hope and love into

Unexpected Messengers

I have vivid memories of sitting in the back of my first grade classroom near the back door of the room. I was in the back and on that side as our desks and chairs were screwed to the floor! Sister Patricia Francis had arranged our seating by our reading groups and mine happened to be on that side of the room. I was in the back as I was tall.

While I was always envious of those students who sat in the front seats, I soon discovered that the back seat of that classroom had some perks. It turns out that seat was the closest to Sister Superior's office. Now, some people might think of this as something ominous, I soon learned that it gave me a few coveted jobs in the school. In 1968 at St. Mary the Morningstar School, in lieu of an intercom system, any important news item was usually passed by a handwritten note to each grade by a messenger. More often than not, I would feel that familiar tap and be called into the hallway by Sister Superior with the instructions, "Take this note to all classrooms and wait for a response, dear." Off I'd go to each classroom on the main floor for grades 1-4 and upstairs for grades 5-8.

I recall being very happy going into each room as I had been taught to knock twice and go into the room. I would hand Sister the note, she would read it, check off her grade on the outside and give it back to me. All went well until I hit the 8th grade classroom. The biggest kids in the school were in there, Sister Agnes Claudia (she was as tough as that name sounds) was their teacher, and the door had a mysterious sign on it that read, "Do Not _______." I could not make out or decipher the word "disturb" and went ahead and knocked on the door. The door swung open quickly and I was greeted with the unkind face of Sister Agnes Claudia. "Can't you read?" she barked. Scared half to death I handed her the note. She came back in a minute, smiled at me and, as she handed me the note said, "Thank you." It all ended well, even though for that day I was an unexpected messenger to the eighth grade class.

Unexpected Messengers

In today's Gospel message, we hear Luke's version of the beginning of John the Baptist's ministry. Now, early on in Luke's gospel we find the story of the angel coming to Zechariah to announce John's conception. John's mother, Elizabeth, is the one who greets Mary and tells her that she is blessed among all women. Now, a first time reader could make this connection and see how John the Baptist could become an unexpected messenger.

Can you imagine the looks on the faces of the people at the sight and sound of John the Baptist? They must have thought this guy was nuts! However, his message was persistent: repent and prepare the way of the Lord! "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Do we still have unexpected messengers today? I believe we do. These messengers come in all shapes and sizes with various backgrounds, degrees, and life experiences. Some messengers are even surprised that they have been called upon to be messengers. Each Advent, as we prepare ourselves to welcome or re-welcome Christ into our lives as we hear the prologues, the preparations and gospel stories, we also have to find our place as "unexpected messengers." Here is the catch: we, as Christians, are all called to serve as messengers. We show the message of the coming of God's Kingdom or Reign in how we act, listen, love, and pray. As "unexpected messengers" we have to prepare ourselves and make straight our own paths to "prepare the way of the Lord." At sometimes, much like walking into that 8th grade classroom, your initial reception may not always be so nice.

In the midst of decorating, shopping, wrapping, celebrating, we must all find times to do what we can to be ready to re-establish our relationship with God and our roles as Christian to be "unexpected messengers." Peace and love, *Taul* **NOVEMBER 2021 PLEDGE INCOME & FINANCE REPORT**

Annual Pledge Income Budget: \$196,000

Pledge receipts through November: \$181,294

With four Sundays left in the year, we find that total pledge receipts shown above, along with other additional gifts to current operations, bring our total receipts to \$191,544.

The 2021 budget passed at Annual Meeting showed our expected expenses exceeding income by about \$68,000. In addition, we encountered unexpected expenses related to the flooding that occurred in the basement and the need to replace our boiler. While it seems that some progress has been made to close the gap, for which we are very thankful, it appears that a large gap between expected expenses and income remains. Please consider if there is anything you can do to help solve this deficit.

Preparation of the 2022 budget is underway. Have you returned your pledge card? Your response is critical to determining whether our expense budget will be in alignment with our income. Please prayerfully consider what this church and its missions mean to you, and consider what you can do to help, as you prepare your 2022 pledge.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE COMMISSION: IRS GIFTING GUIDANCE

As we approach the end of the year, we are mindful of the IRS guidance regarding taxdeductible gifts. This has prompted us to send this reminder regarding the IRS rules that we must follow regarding reporting of gifts, from which there can be no exceptions.

To qualify as a gift for tax year 2021, the gift must either

1) if mailed, be postmarked on or before Friday, December 31, 2021, or

2) be delivered to the church office no later than between 12 pm and 3 pm on Friday, December 31st, at which time Pastor Chip's office hours close.

We must point out this example: a check dated on or before December 31 which does not meet the criteria listed above will be counted as a gift received in 2022. If made to fulfill a 2021 pledge, it will be so noted and appear as "Pledge – Prior Year" in the 2022 accounting.
