A note from Pastor Chip

Dear Church Family,

For the past several months, I have been engaged in the UCC Search and Call process. As a part of that process, I was chosen by the Pastoral Search Committee at Roslindale Congregational Church to be a candidate for their position of Senior Pastor. On July 10th, I led a worship service in their sanctuary, and following the service they held a congregational meeting, at which they voted to call me as their settled pastor. I accepted their call, and therefore, I am resigning my position as Senior Pastor at Wilbraham United Church following worship on October 16.

It has not been an easy season of discernment for me. I have tried to faithfully and prayerfully balance the needs of this congregation, the needs of my ministerial calling, and the needs of my family. My decision to seek and accept a call elsewhere should not be seen as a reflection of my love and care for WUC and all of you. Indeed, I think it is in the best interest of the congregation for me to move on so that WUC can begin to explore specifically where and how it is being called by God in this time and place.

I am sad to leave a church that has meant so much to me over the last four years. WUC has left a tremendous impact on my life and on my heart. This has been an incredibly rewarding and affirming part of my faith journey. I am grateful to so many people, and for so many things.

You welcomed and embraced me – and Alison, and our children – and made us feel at home among you. We will miss being a part of this community, but we will cherish the memories that we have made together. We have been truly blessed by the profound love and grace of this community and will never forget our time here with you.

I want to thank all of you for the support and the encouragement, through the challenges and the opportunities that we have faced together and the road that we have walked together. It has been a joy and blessing to serve with all of you, to be a part of this faith community. Whoever is called to serve as your next pastor will be blessed to have such gracious and faithful disciples alongside them.

I have much more to say, and I hope that I will have the time (and the ability) to more fully express how much you all have meant to me, and the great things that I believe God has in store for you in the future. We have walked in love as God loved us, and even as our paths will take us on different journeys in the future, we will still be walking together as long as we share in that same love.

We need volunteers to step forward to take charge of the Thrift Shop. The shop has been closed since March 2020 due to COVID and needs new leadership. After several years of dedication, Donna Carlson and Nancy Krawczynski are stepping aside for new leaders.

Over the last 2.5 years, many have said they do not want the Thrift Shop to close as it is a great resource to our community and a wonderful mission for our church. Yet...no one has stepped up to take charge. The doors remain closed, the items are collecting dust...

We are at an impasse. We are at the point of an ultimatum.

The Thrift Shop will officially close if no one (or no group) steps up to take charge before August 31st.

Donna and Nancy have offered to support and guide anyone who is willing. They have also provided the following information to help give more insight into what is needed to take on this task.

Thrift Shop FAQ: How many hours do I need to commit to each week?

With two co-managers, each of you would need to commit about 8-10 hours per week. The commitment would be less with more volunteers.

What do I do?

Clean and sort all dropped off donations Ensure all donations are in working order

Price all items, Arrange and set up donations in shop

Restocking items on Fridays ahead of Saturday shop hours

Counting money, recording sales and providing profits/ records to bookkeeper

Do I have to do everything myself? No

Who will help me? Other volunteers!

You will need 2 adult volunteers each shop day The more volunteers, the lighter the workload!

Do I have to do any paperwork? Only a little Quarterly: Since the Thrift Shop donates a portion of all proceeds to non-profit groups, one of the managers will need to send a letter, along with a check to the previously determined non-profit recipient.

Annually: A short annual report to the Church Council with a summary of profits, donation recipients and general updates. The managers and volunteers will elect the next year's donation recipients.

How much money does the church make from the Thrift Shop?

Wilbraham United Church received 50% of the proceeds

The remaining is split up as: 40% to the chosen non-profit groups, 10% is discretionary for use in the shop.

JUNE 2022 PLEDGE INCOME & FINANCE REPORT

Annual Pledge Income Budget: \$158,000

Pledge receipts through September: \$119,977

We thank you for your gifts.

Pledge income through June reflects an early influx of \$65,900 of fullyear pledge donations. Amortizing for these pre-paid pledges, pledge giving through June is ahead of budget by \$8,000. But we are \$72,000 short of the amount needed to balance the budget deficit passed at annual meeting.

The value of invested funds is down 9.61% through June. Although the value is down, our conservative value focused portfolio fared better than others which include more growth stocks. However, the drop in value along with high inflation is concerning. Fortunately, no withdrawals from invested funds have been needed yet this year. This is due to a carryover of \$31,000 from 2021 along with the early influx of full-year pledge donations.

We are in the midst of summer when church attendance (and giving) often slows. Please help to keep our fellowship and mission active and healthy during the summer season.

Again, thank you for your gifts and continued support.

What is a Capital Campaign?

A Capital Campaign is an effort on the part of a non-profit to raise significant funds. These funds are raised to fund major projects, benefit our community, and fund our endowment to secure the future of our church. A Capital Campaign usually last from 1-3 years and have has many benefits. <u>Boomerang</u> defines some benefits of a Capital Campaign:

Raising the money to fund a one-time need for the organization—in most cases having a building that meets the needs of the community served by the organization.

Strengthening the organization's infrastructure—working on a campaign requires that the organization evaluate its readiness for a campaign, and subsequently build an infrastructure to run a campaign including staffing, board commitment, software to manage the campaign, gift acceptance policies, etc. This stronger infrastructure will leave the organization in a much better position to do ongoing fundraising.

Increased public awareness—during a campaign, there will be a great deal of publicity and cultivation efforts to help raise awareness of the organization in the community. These efforts, like the strengthened infrastructure, will help the organization's future fundraising efforts.

This campaign will be a true group effort, and we thank you in advance for your help during this important time in our church.
