Greetings from the Music Room

It's been busy times as we enter this season which brings excitement and preparations. All the choirs are in full swing getting ready for Holy Week. Palm Sunday – Maundy Thursday – Good Friday (being held at Christ the King Epiphany – WUC is invited to attend the service and also sing in the choir) – and finally Easter Sunday. Each of these services carry different parts of the message about the journey experienced by Jesus during this week.

Junior Choir and Chancel Choir will sing Antiphonal Hosanna together on Palm Sunday, which opens up Holy Week with a clear message of that day, making it a significant part of the whole picture as it unfolds. Bell Choir, Chancel Choir and Junior Choir will contribute additional music with sounds and texts that bring emphasis to the events of the week.

We will welcome Richard Cuoco on Easter Sunday as he joins the Bell and Chancel choirs with sparks of trumpet sounds. We will also hear him on the French Horn with organ accompaniment for a short postlude, leading into the Easter Egg hunt, a joyous conclusion to the morning and the week.

Blessing Box: Wilbraham United is now the host of a Blessing Box. Local boy scout Luke Whalen-Sylver from Troop 359 has installed a Blessing Box at the rear of the church adjacent to the parking lot. The box has been stocked with food pantry and hygiene items for those who may be in need. The box is intended to be stocked not only by the church but by others who wish to donate items to keep the box filled. We've already observed members of the community who have stopped by with donations! Donations may be placed directly in the box. Our Discipleship Commission will monitor the box to make sure that it remains stocked with items that will be available for those who need immediate food relief. We are excited about our new ability to aid our community in fighting hunger. We will need a reliable stream of food items and right now we are asking for dry goods such as cereal, rice, baking mixes, dried beans and pasta. 


