There's plenty of space in the Sanctuary for more bell ringers and in the Music Room for additional singers. Anyone wishing to join one of the groups is welcome at any time. (No worries about not being able to be there every week.) As we begin rehearsals in September is a great time to give us a try.

All choir groups join the rest of the congregation in welcoming the interim clergy arriving later this month, Rev. Janet Sandquist-Skagerlind.



LOAVES AND FISHES FYI

For those unfamiliar with this church mission, six casseroles are delivered monthly to be served for lunch in Springfield. Betsy and Stuart Johnsen did the preparation for years and Sandy and Larry Harris have been involved in Loaves and Fishes since this Springfield food program began, even before they joined WUC. The program feeds over one hundred daily. Many in church helped serve on the third Thursday of a month before Covid. Judy Hoffman made sure that desserts were donated monthly.

Cakes were made by volunteers but since Covid packaged cookies have been necessary. There is a storage collection bin in the kitchen. Cookies can always be added. Likewise white rice, vegetables or chicken can donated. All go into the casseroles which are very nutritious and flavorful.



Sandy and Larry Harris and Edna Colcord assumed responsibility for the mission when the Johnsens moved. Twelve huge casseroles are prepared every other month with the help from other dedicated church members: a faithful group who have worked out glitches and become increasingly efficient.



While the Main Office required more prep work before painting the Christian Ed Office got started on refreshing the paint on the walls.


Thank you to all the volunteers who came in and helped with cleaning, prepping, painting and those who donated to help out with the cost of the project!

For the next few Branchline issues we're going to be highlighting our different commissions and the work that those volunteers do to keep the church moving forward.

The current members of the Fellowship Commission are:

Fellowship Commission's focus lies in anything to do with church membership. We welcome guests, and are responsible for hosting New Member services. We attempt to keep our church directory current and accurate. We make sure there are visitor cards in pews and follow up with anyone requesting information about the church. We staff church commissions. We run the annual stewardship campaign. We meet quarterly or more often as needed.

Wilbraham United Church's membership is fluid. People move, pass on, grow up, go to college, marry, and leave the church for many reasons. We are responsible for keeping our Church directory and membership up to date. We meet 2-3 times a year to review the directory and update it and make corrections. We attempt to contact those members who have been absent. We request that all members and active non-members keep their contact information current. Directories are available for members and active non-members by request to the office administrator.

Stewardship scared everyone! It drives people away from Fellowship Commission because no one wants to ask for money! Fellowship will not directly ask anyone for money, when asking for pledges. We no longer call on people in their homes, or make phone calls. Pledge requests are sent by mail and email. We believe the decision to make a pledge, and how much of a pledge, is between you and God. Money is not a dirty word. The church needs money to run. There are utilities, insurance, maintenance, STEEPLE REPAIRS, upgrades and staff to fund. We hope everyone will be moved to pledge as much as they can afford. Without pledges there will be no church.

In order to plan a Stewardship Campaign, Fellowship and the pastor brainstorm a theme, usually related to whatever is happening in the church at Stewardship time. Devising a theme is the most difficult part. We arrange for speakers from the congregation to speak during the service on Stewardship Sunday. We may host a related event after church as well. The minister drafts a stewardship letter, which we mail along with pledge cards. Parishioners return pledge cards to church or mail pledges back to the Finance Secretary. This is a once yearly event!

In addition to caring for and keeping track of our membership, and stewardship, we are responsible for staffing the commissions. This is our most difficult task. Currently, there are openings on Hospitality, Fellowship, Administration and Finance commissions. We also need an auditor and an alternate Clerk, to take Church Council minutes when the Clerk cannot attend meetings. We understand that people are busy. However, in order to maintain a healthy church, we need adequate volunteers to staff commissions. Volunteering is also an excellent way to meet people and develop bonds with other members.

Fellowship will be brainstorming ways to increase parish involvement on commissions. We will get as creative as possible, while maintaining accountability. I will be asking for commission volunteers during the annual meeting. Please contact me for questions about individual commissions. No one volunteering for a commission will be thrown into anything without needed instruction.
