We were very grateful to see Ed and Janet McCorkindale in the audience supporting us!


Many of us are looking forward to next summer when the National Conference will be held in Hartford! It will be our first time attending Nationals so it's very exciting to have it located locally!

Celebration Sunday












Save Our Steeple!
