Thoughts about Stewardship

Deciding What to Give

While there are many ways to support the congregation, our annual campaign provides a chance to think in a particular and prayerful way about the choices we make with our money in support of the church. Without your gifts, we would not be able to engage in the ministry and worship experiences that define our community life.

Deciding how much of our income to donate to charitable organizations can be difficult. We encourage our community to think of giving as a percentage of annual income. The average gift to charitable causes in our country is 2% of annual income (per household). It is hard to imagine what our church would look like without these generous gifts that do so much good. Fortunately, we are not being asked to consider what the church would be without these gifts! Instead, we are being asked to imagine what just 1% or more might make happen!

Giving even 1% more of annual income to the church would be transformative for our congregation and the community that we serve.

We are each on a journey toward abundant generosity. What next step can you take in your generosity journey? Every gift to our congregation helps strengthen who we are and what we can do together.

Paying your Pledge

Did you know...?

We currently have 104 Families who could be pledging to the church. Only 52% actually pledge.

As of November 1st, 48 of the pledging families are behind on their pledges for the year; and 12 of those have paid \$0.00. We know that people move in their own time and way. We hope that this is received as a gentle reminder that our church family depends on you!

Our church's annual budget and the cash flow to pay bills are dependent for the most part on our pledges coming in, as planned, at the beginning of the year. As of November 1st, pledges and plate giving are about \$19,000 behind. Our average monthly expenses are exceeding our income by about \$1800 a month, which correlates directly to the unpaid pledges.

One way to keep your pledge up to date is to set up online giving payments. Your weekly (or monthly) pledge can be directly withdrawn from your bank account, or charged to your credit card. Refer to the Online Giving information on our website or on the insert provided with the Stewardship mailing.

How We Did

Over the course of 17 days beginning with our unloading day October 15th, through Halloween, October 31st, we sold \$7,792 in pumpkins and raised \$1596 in donations!

Our total sales made us eligible for a higher earnings bracket—moving us from the base percent of 25% to 30% raised by the church for our Steeple.

Countless volunteers helped us unload the truck on the 15th and we were selling pumpkins while they were still coming off the truck!

We sat outside in the sun and heat as well as the cold and the rain and we sold some pumpkins every day! While our Fall Festival on the 21st got rained out, we still were very successful with our bake sale!

Thank you thank you to everyone who moved pumpkins, sold pumpkins, baked and sold baked goods and helped paint pumpkins! And to those who also came back to get rid of the left-overs! Don't worry—pumpkins were donated to local farms for animal feed, as well as put out for the wildlife to enjoy.

Overall we made \$3933.78 for the Save Our Steeple fund and became a visible minister to our neighbors! We're looking forward to Pumpkin Patch 2024!!




In an effort to increase our fund raising, we will be initiating a monthly "pre-order" opportunity.
