OLD TESTAMENT READING

So she said, "Look, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law." But Ruth said, "Do not press me to leave you, to turn back from following you! NEW TESTAMENT READING

If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions and if I hand over my body so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. - Peter Holy Spirit
 - Gentiles
 Baptism

The word *gentile* refers to people who are not Jewish. In the Old Testament, the term usually referred to pagans, or people who worshipped false gods (or no god at all). In the New Testament, *gentile* sometimes referred to early Christian communities. After Jesus' death, many of Jesus' followers came to believe he was the Messiah. Despite many cultural similarities, this belief put them outside of the Jewish religious heritage.
