Hello! from the Music Room

From the Music Room

Have you noticed some of the voices from the pipe organ and piano sounding a little different - for lack of better terminology..... a little "off" and literally out of tune? The weather plays a big role in the way these instruments speak. Too hot, too cold, too humid, too dry.... all these weather related circumstances create conditions that make various sound anomalies show up.

Some of it is an overall sound variation that happens when several notes are slightly out of tune. But when they're played together in chords or octaves all the notes being played sound strange. Some notes are so out of tune that they can't be used. In the pipe organ, entire groups (ranks) of pipes have historic issues of difficulty staying their course with tuning issues. The reed pipes - the ones that sound like trumpets, horns, clarinets.... they are notorious for leaping out of tune with very minimal changes in conditions.

The sanctuary piano is assisted in its stability by a humidifier which is added by the owner (WUC in this case). I'm always amazed when I check on it during humid weather and it's still wanting a supply of water. The strings or the sound board can alter ever so slightly, and there goes the perfectly tuned piano. It is much like the organ in the overall sound being "off" when several notes are not perfectly in line. In general there is more often a chance that a piano will stay closer in tune than a pipe organ. But no matter what, they are wonderful to use even if those little waves show up in the sounds produced. Both instruments are happy in their surroundings and are sized very well for the sanctuary space.

Enjoy the remains of the summer. It always goes so fast !!!


Pillowcases for Springfield Rescue Mission
