NEW TESTAMENT READING

1 Peter 2: 4-10

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

This honor, then, is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," and "A stone that makes them stumble and a rock that makes them fall."





LIVE IT

For families to do together

Make a family tree with stars instead of branches and leaves. Cut out or draw stars and make as many stars as people in your extended family that you know! You might make a mobile or mural or decorate someone's bedroom ceiling. Be creative and have fun with it.

For younger kids

Ask someone to show you how to draw stars. When you learn (or if you already know), teach someone else.

For older kids

Plan a star hunt for someone younger than you. Make some paper stars with a word on each one to spell a message, like GOD, LOVES, and YOU. Play a game of hiding the stars and guiding each other with clues to find them. Unscramble the message together
