And speaking of wilderness, March heralds in the somber days of Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 5, all the way to Holy Week. The forty days of the Lenten season mirrors the forty days which Christ spent in the wilderness, enduring very human struggles. For in this wilderness time, Jesus lacked food and comforts, and was void of human companionship. Moreover, Jesus was visited by the evil one, who did his best to lure him into sin by offering him all manner of worldly riches and power. Even in his weakened state, Jesus did not succumb to the Tempter. There is much we can learn from Jesus's time in the wilderness.

For us, this Lenten season is the perfect time to build our faith, grow closer to our God, practice our spirituality and meditate on how Jesus dealt with suffering and temptation. While we wait in the wilderness of March madness, this is a perfect time to establish some Lenten rituals; prayer time, spiritual studies, generous acts of giving, worship....our faith.

God speaks to all of us in marvelous and mysterious ways. We just have to still ourselves and be open to letting God in. God is always with us, although, we may not always be aware of God's proximity to us. The world is full of toils and snares, and the Tempter is hard at work causing misery and pain. Indeed, the Tempter is a master of distraction, chaos and deceit. He is always trying to make it difficult for us to hear God's voice and do God's work. Thus, we are called to fight evil and resist the call of the Tempter.

The theologian and author, Henri Nouwen once wrote:

"The more you are called to speak for God's love, the more you will need to deepen the knowledge of that love in your own heart. The farther the outward journey takes you, the deeper the inward journey must be. Only when your roots are deep can your fruits be abundant. The enemy is there, waiting to destroy you, but you can face the enemy without fear when you know that you are held safe in the love of Jesus."

Let us be assured that we are not alone in this wilderness. God is with us, and God will provide us the strength to bear ourselves standing up, and overcome our struggles ahead.

March brings the beginning of Lent, Daylight Savings Time, Spring and St. Patrick's Day. All four days have significance for many of us. We might take time to be more introspective during Lent, which begins on March 5th, and reflect on the activities of Fat Tuesday. Daylight savings time messes with our internal clock as well as the ones keeping track of the time. (It's coming this Sunday, the 9th - we lose a precious hour of sleep.) St. Patrick's Day, March 17th, honors the patron Saint of Ireland and the arrival of Christianity to the island nation. St. Patrick lived c. 385 - 461; March 17 is the date of his death. Spring will arrive with the Vernal Equinox at 5:01 AM on March 20 when the sun crosses the equator at the point giving us almost equal lengths of day and night.

Sunday, March 9 (the first Sunday in Lent) will bring lively and celebratory sounds to the Wilbraham United Church sanctuary during our worship service. The combined Chancel Choir and Praise Band will present Glory, Glory! (I Feel Better), an arrangement of a traditional spiritual that's full of energy, life and sound. We've all been working on it for weeks now, and the 9th is going to invite listeners to tap their toes and say "Hallelujah!," as the anthem rolls along. In many churches, "Hallelujah" and "Alleluia" are reserved for the arrival of Easter Sunday and the seasons that follow right up to Lent the next year. Although we're already into Lent, on March 9 our schedules have lined up, just like the sun over the equator, so almost all choir members will be available to celebrate March and all that it brings.

Atomic and Digital clocks will set themselves - but if you have an alarm clock like mine, be sure to set it ahead on Saturday night!
