We are blessed with busy calendars, activities and options. May we enjoy the days ahead.



As we have heard over the last couple of weeks, Wilbraham United Church is facing challenging budgetary issues. The Church Council is making concerted efforts to spend wisely and to save where possible. As with any house, building, workspace, etc., there will always be expenditures. Most costs are budgeted and some, unfortunately, are not.

This building, in which we worship on a daily, weekly, monthly basis will be here long after we have passed from our physical forms and into the Kingdom of God. I suggest that we embrace every moment that we have here and focus on things more important than line items on a ledger.

Since I joined this church family 30 years ago, we have always struggled to balance the budget, yet we are still here. Our numbers may be lower than in the past, but our Spirit is stronger than I can recollect. We have been fortunate to receive monetary gifts in the past that

have given us the opportunity to make structural repairs, maintain staffing and benefits, and to ensure gifting to individuals and foundations that rely on our Christian generosity.

We have stressed the importance of Stewardship and pledging, and we shall see how our church members respond to that message. In the meantime, we will continue to proceed in a fiscally responsible manner, but more importantly, we should continue to go forward with faith. So often, when we rely on faith, good things happen. We have seen it time and time again within these church walls, and I believe if we look at our own lives, it has happened there, as well.

I personally would rather be a part of a community that works hard together to maintain a house of worship and faith than be part of a sterile, shiny and modern facility with little to no struggles. In my humble opinion, the CHURCH that Jesus started and offered to us as a gift, requires us to struggle and sacrifice with our Christianity to reap the benefits of God's gifts. These gifts are invaluable, attainable, and worth the effort of each of us to accept.

For hundreds of years after Jesus died for us, Christians have been condemned, exiled and martyred for their faith in him and his teachings. The sacrifices we make today may be burdensome and challenging to us, but they pale in comparison to the early Christian followers. Still, His Church is still here, not just by monetary gifts and offerings, but by faith.

These thoughts stem from listening to, and being a part of conversations regarding the "B" word... budget. This church hasn't come this far by being frustrated and hamstrung with budget woes; it has become what it is by Faith. When we pray for our church and those within it, it is our faith that continues to carry us over and through turbulent times. Having faith and praying for Thanksgiving will ease our burdens, not just here but out in the world.
