Welcome to the month of May,

May is one of my favorite months because this is when everything in the created world begins to burst. Living things awaken from their winter's rest; flowers bloom, little buds appear, bees come out of their hives, all giving witness to God's marvelous handiwork. All this life springing forth is so in keeping with this season of Eastertide. Yes I know, the Big Event has happened, the resurrection of Jesus has taken place, the chocolate has been consumed, the Easter baskets have been emptied, the Easter flowers are looking a little wilted, but Easter is not over. We remain in the season of Eastertide.

Eastertide is a liturgical period which lasts for fifty days, beginning on Easter and ending on Pentecost Sunday. Eastertide, of course, celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It also commemorates his ascension in to heaven, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and other subsequent events.

Eastertide is a time to celebrate the new life which we have been gifted because of Jesus's sacrifice, and to acknowledge his victory over death. In this season, the lectionary readings often focus on the Acts of the Apostles, which is about what those disciples did after the ascension of Jesus. The book of Acts also tells of the beginnings of the Christian church.

I often think of what those disciples did in their ministry, because it took them a little while to pull themselves together. We know that during Jesus's public ministry, they needed a lot of support from Jesus, as they tried to follow in his ways, model his good works, and fully comprehend what Jesus was trying to convey. It wasn't easy for them, but after the resurrection, the knowledge of Jesus transformed them. Jesus's presence and teachings fortressed them and gave them the courage to move forward, do their good works and carry out their mission of spreading the Good News of Jesus and building up the Christian church.

There can be little doubt that Jesus changed those disciples profoundly, took them out of their comfort zone and transformed them into confident and resilient Apostles who were moving into a future which was assured.

Our Faith and our commitment to God will help to make us strong and resilient people, who have the courage to follow Christ, like the disciples did. And in a world that seems increasingly uncertain, the certainty of a loving and forgiving God, and the promise of life anew, eclipses all else.

## **Roof Project Status**

The total cost of the roof project (which started May 5th!) is estimated to be \$78,580. The Phys Ops Endowment allotment of \$10,000 (for 2024 and 2025) will be allocated to this project. In addition a portion of the bequest from the Vieira estate of \$51068 will be used for the roof repair. To date \$6246 in Shingle Sponsor donations and money from the Fanfare Brass Concert has been raised! After some small additional expenses we still need to raise \$11441.

We anticipate that the roofing work will be completed before the middle of May.
