

In Lieu of Mums An ACTS Fundraiser This is the time of year when our church would usually be supporting the Action Centered Tutoring Services organization through their annual MUM sale.

Checks made payable to ACTS and cash donations will be collected by Andrea Stephenson on Sept 7 & 14



The ACTS Mum Sale grower had a devastating fire in March and there will be no flower sale this year. (The sales represented 20% of ACTS operating budget.) Each fall the Mum Sale helped launch the tutoring service programs. Despite this setback, they are about to begin their 40th consecutive year with 6 sites providing free, after-school tutoring to the elementary school children of Springfield. In the past, WUC has contributed over \$800 in Mum purchases to this important fundraiser.

Please consider donating what you might have purchased in the past (or perhaps more) to help ACTS recover these lost revenues. Your gifts can be considered a charitable donation since ACTS is a 501 (c) 3 charity. Gifts can be made in cash or check made out to ACTS. Please complete a donor form (available in the Narthex or from Andrea) so that ACTS has a record of your gift and to enable them to send you a proper thank you.
