The Word

1 Corinthians 12:4-12

Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of powerful deeds, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. We recognize that the work of our search committee is a difficult assignment and will take much effort. We pray for you and offer our support and words of encouragement throughout this time. These things we promise in the hope and belief that you will be obedient to the guidance of the Holy Spirit as you seek a new pastor to minister with us.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Jonah 3: 6-10

We moved to Wilbraham and were looking for a church for our family.

Came here with my parents around 2004. Parents wanted us to come to a church in the town where we lived and with the kids we went to school with. The church had a vibrant & bustling youth fellowship program.

Brought to this church by a church member whose husband worked with my husband, back in the early 70s. First intro to church was through Women's Evening Fellowship.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE PART OF OUR CHURCH?

The community.

Quiet, simple & traditional service. Kind & welcoming people, good caring pastors, strong biblical teaching.

Music, fellowship, and Janet's Sermons.

The people in the church! I also love the connection to community theater through the Wilbraham United Players.

Community & fellowship.

Readings, Hymns, and the minister.

Many favorites. Music program, youth Christian Ed program, friendly & welcoming people, meaningful church services.

The community aspect of the church and intergenerational relationships.

Sunday services and the people.

WHAT WAS YOUR FIRST EXPERIENCE OF OUR CHURCH?

I walked in and was warmly welcomed by several people. It was a good experience and I connected with the message.

We took all of our very young kids and the service was exceptionally long due to a baptism/baptism renewal. Many people came up to us afterwards to welcome us and let us know the services are not usually that long.

Welcoming, children friendly.

Earliest memory was Sunday School.

When we moved to the area 8 years ago, we looked online for churches then visited those we selected. Handbells was a plus. We went to Fellowship Hour when we first visited. This couldn't have been better. The members who greeted us were super welcoming. When I mentioned handbells, Mark came right over as well as someone who played handbells.

The welcoming people.

Participating in confirmation class.

Attending the monthly meetings of Women's Evening Fellowship. We were new to the community, so this was a good way to meet people.

We are the heart of this welcoming community. Some people grew up in this church and some have recently walked through the doors. We came to Wilbraham United Church as part of our faith journey. Faith brought us here – faith and this church bring us back.
