OLD TESTAMENT READING

Isaiah 63: 7-9

Hebrews 2: 10-18

I will recount the gracious deeds of the Lord, the praiseworthy acts of the Lord, because of all that the Lord has done for us and the great favor to the house of Israel that he has shown them according to his mercy, according to the abundance of his steadfast love.

For he said, "Surely they are my people, children who will not act deceitfully," and he became their savior in all their distress.

It was no messenger or angel but his presence that saved them; in his love and pity it was he who redeemed them; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, saying, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."

And again, "I will put my trust in him."

And again, "Here am I and the children whom God has given me."

Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. 

Year End Pledge Reminder: As we approach the end of the year, there are two worship service dates left in 2025. This prompts this reminder regarding the IRS rules that we must follow regarding reporting of gifts, from which there can be no exceptions.

To qualify as a gift for tax year 2025, the gift must be either:

- 1) if mailed, be postmarked on or before Wednesday, December 31, 2025, or
- 2) be placed in the offering today.

Further, if the gift is a check, the check must be dated on or before December 31, 2025.

We must point out this example: a check dated on or before December 31 that does not meet the criteria listed above will be counted as a gift received in 2026. If made to fulfill a 2025 pledge, it will be noted and appear as "Pledge – Prior Year" in the 2026 accounting.

The Fellowship Commission would like to remind our church membership that **pledge cards** for 2026 can still be turned in. If you have forgotten to turn yours in, please do so as soon as possible. We're already entering the budgetary process for the new year and knowing our expected pledge income is a key part of that planning. Just a friendly reminder – if you are a "one and done" pledger – your check is gratefully received, but we'd still like to receive a card from you for our bookkeeping purposes. If you need a card they are available in the Narthex or you can see Deb in the office.
